The Library's 2023-24 fiscal year budget and trustee election is scheduled for Tuesday, April 11, 2023. There is one position on the Board of Trustees up for election, currently held by Gabrielle Giacomazzo. This position is a five (5) year term of office, expiring on June 30, 2028. Those interested in running for the position must:

1. Be current residents of the Lindenhurst Union Free School District and may only be nominated by petition.
2. Petitions must be signed by at least 25 qualified voters of the school district, and the petition shall state the residence of each signer, as well as the name and residence of the candidate.
3. Each petition shall be filed with the office of the Library Director no later than 5:00 PM on Wednesday, March 1, 2023.
4. Petition forms will be available at the Lindenhurst Memorial Library's Customer Service desk beginning Wednesday, February 1, 2023.
