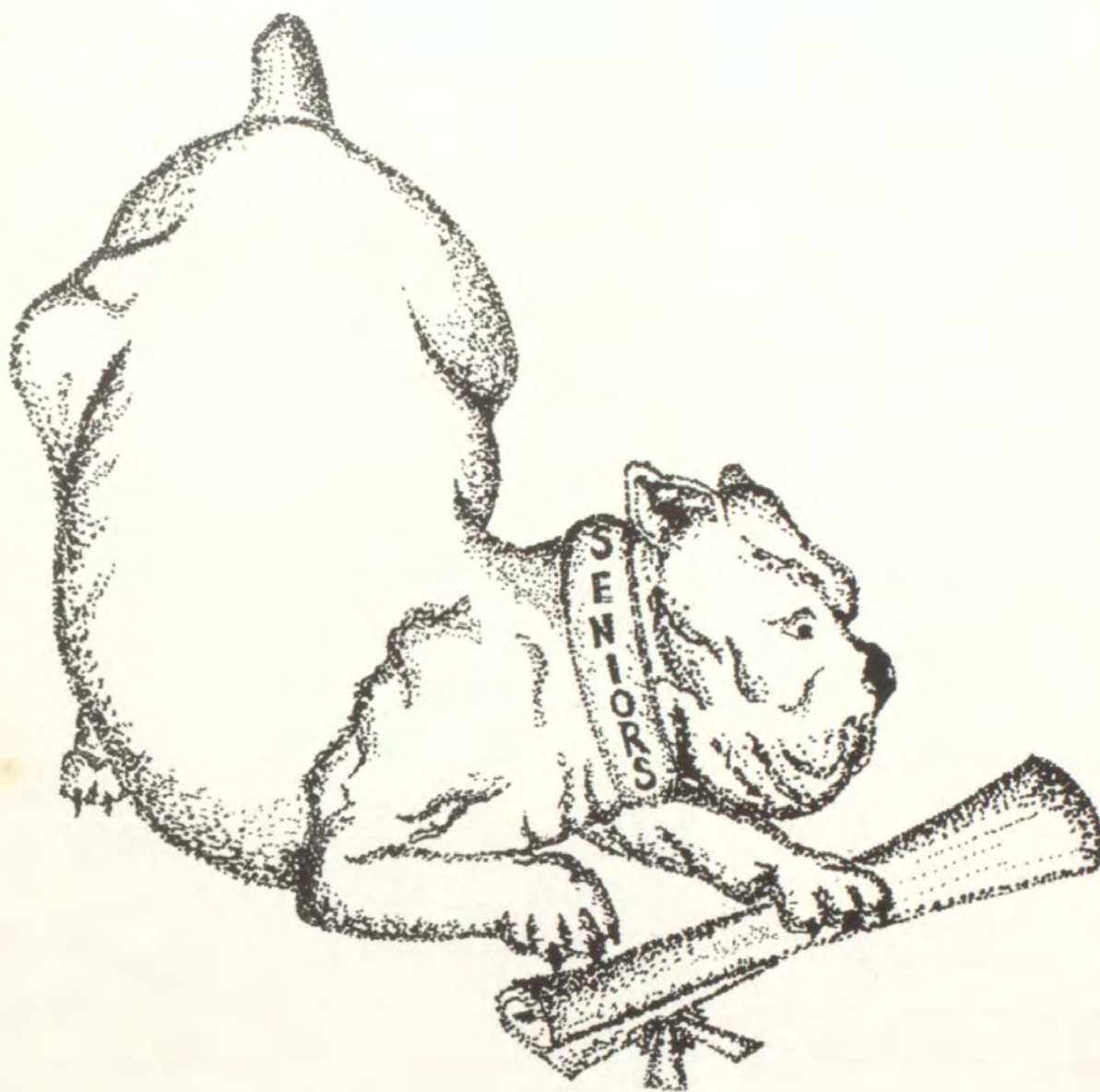






# SENIORS
