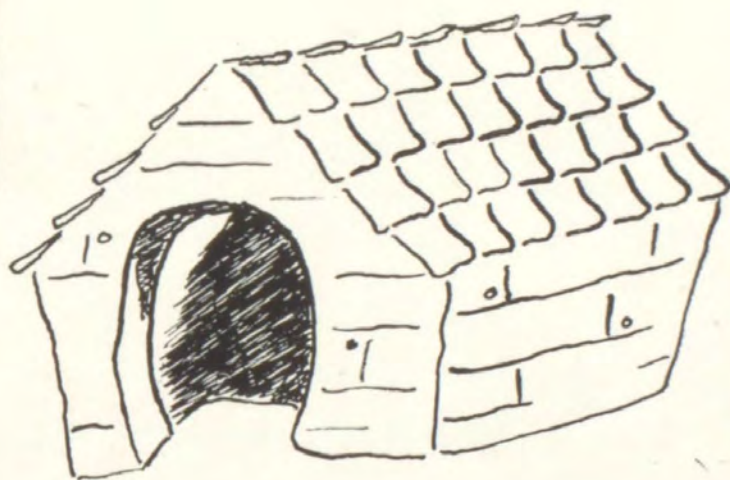

Foreword

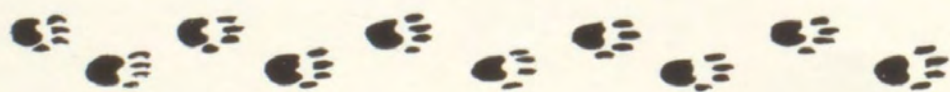

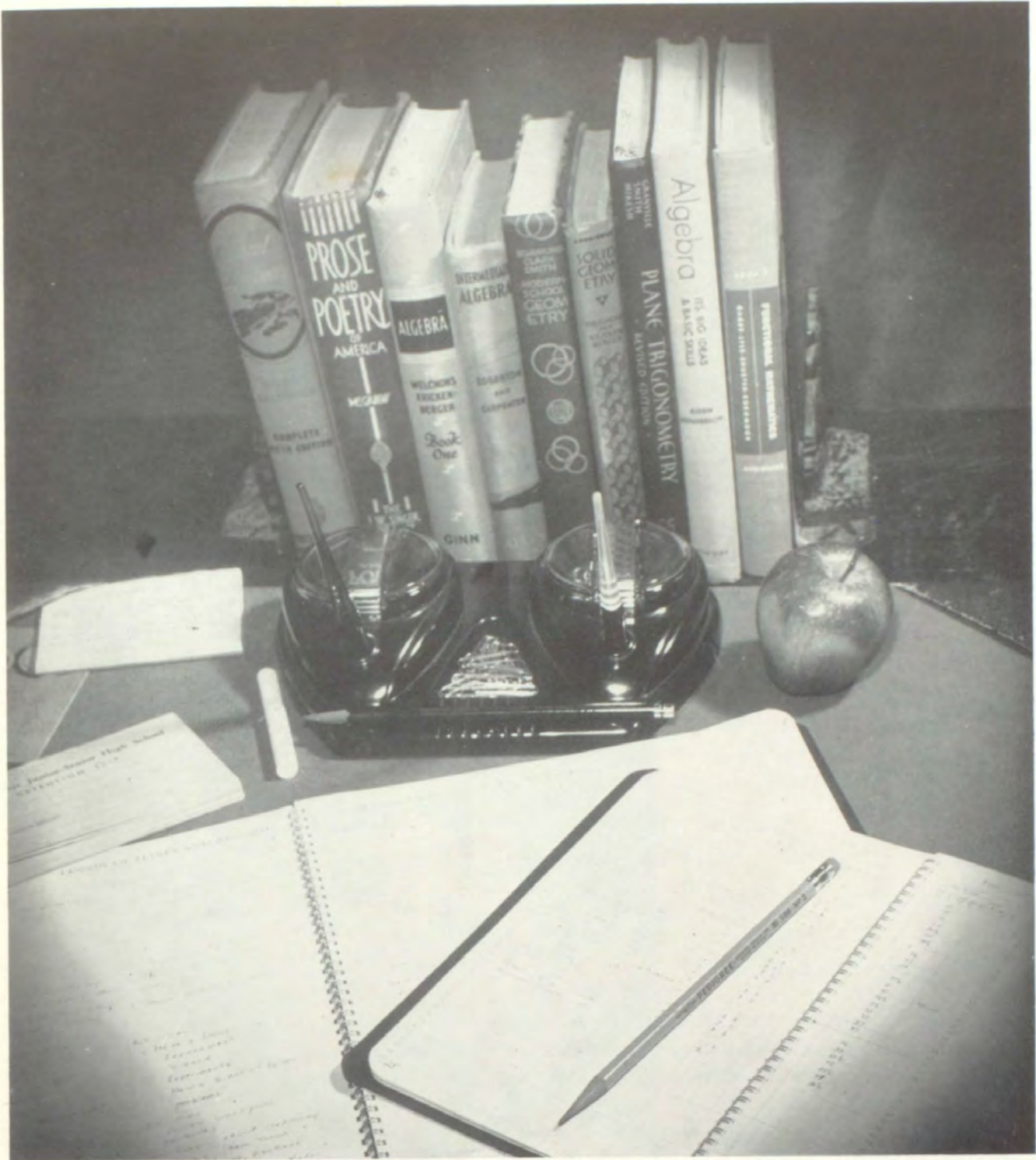




Dedication

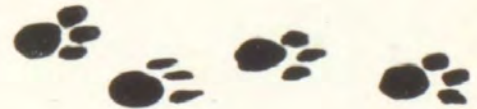
To the Members of the Class of '56

JACK KESS

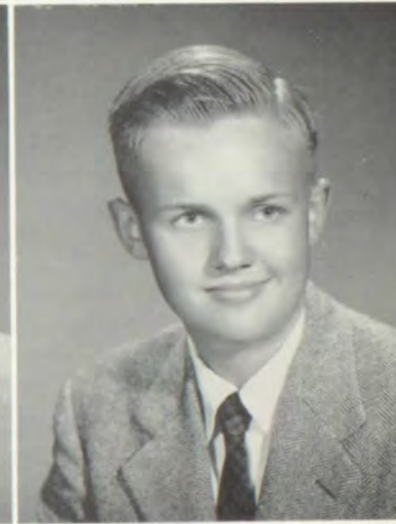
Jack participated in sports while at Lindy Hi. His majors were math and science and he preferred math. He hopes to be rich and dislikes knee socks and Bermuda shorts.
