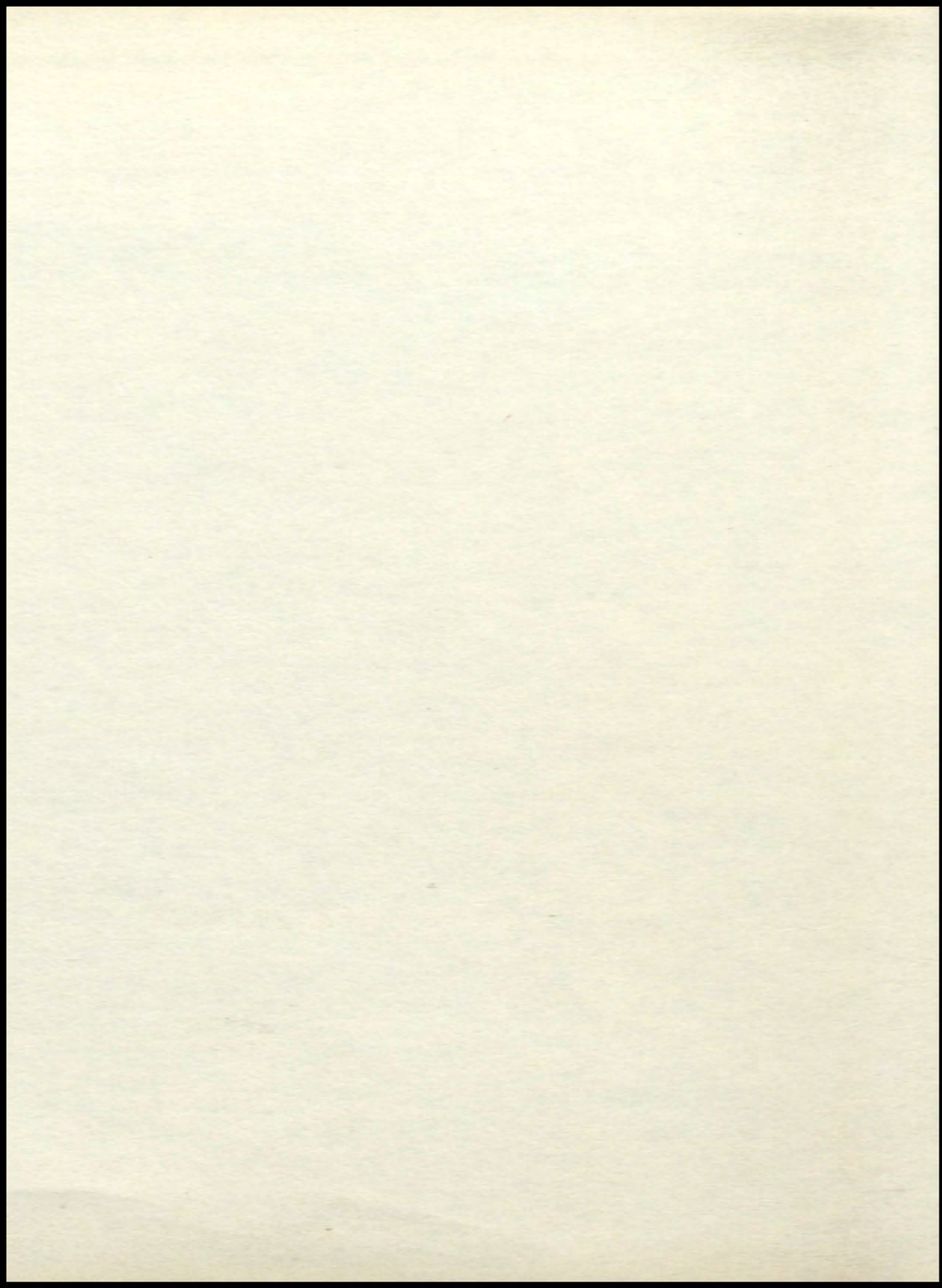

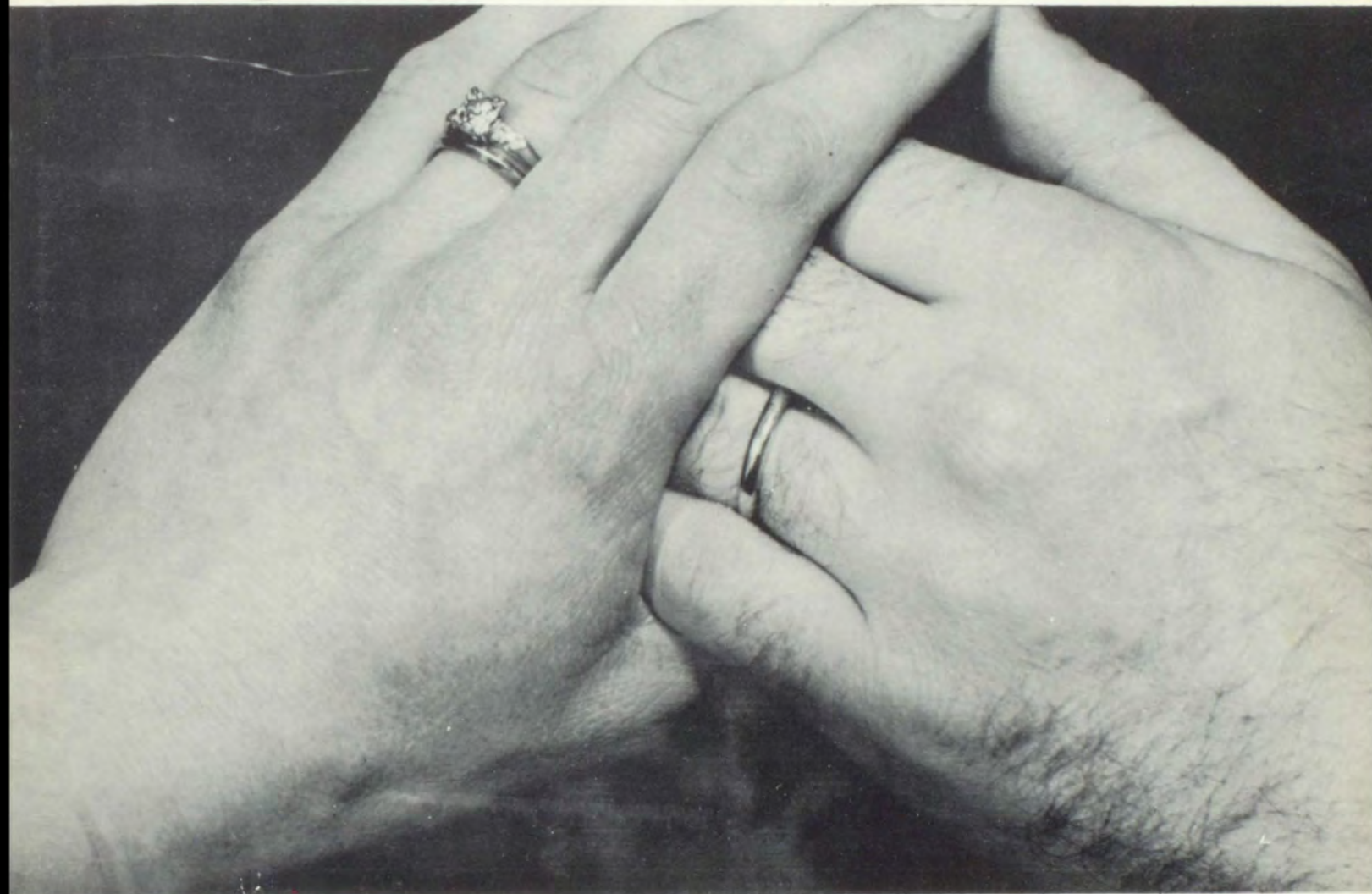
Pictured above is the architect's drawing of the new addition to the Lindenhurst Junior-Senior High School.

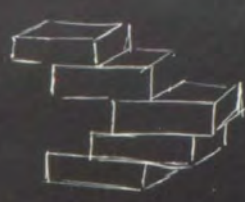

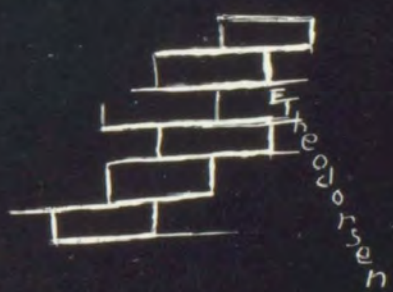

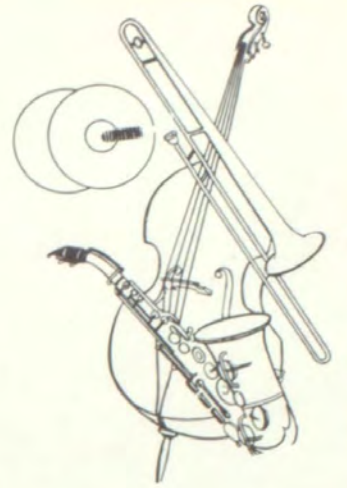

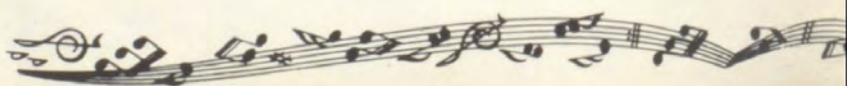

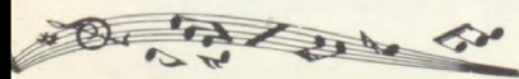

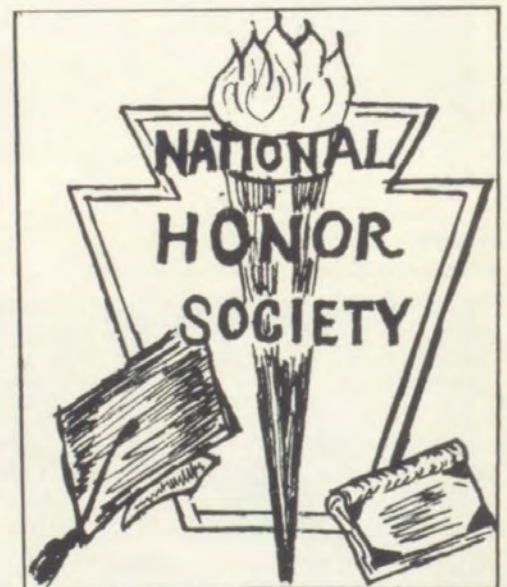
