In her leisure time, Ms. McMullen is an avid tennis player, golfer, camper and beach-goer. Her favorite phrase was, and remains 'It's a beautiful day in Lindenhurst.'

MARK BIEGLUK - LINDY'S ALL AMERICAN

Mark Biegluk is a two time All-American swimmer at Lindenhurst High School. A junior, Mark has received All-League, All-County, All-Long Island and All-State honors in his first two years on the team.

As a sophomore, Mark set the Suffolk County record in the 100 yard and 100 meter breaststroke events, becoming the first Lindenhurst swimmer to ever hold a County record. He was a member of the All-County 400 Freestyle Relay Team, which included teammates Robert Urban, Craig Faber, and Kevin Mahnken. Mark also was Long Island's best in the 200 Individual Medley and 200 Medley Relay.

This year, Mark swam the breaststroke leg of the League Champion 200 Medley relay and anchored the All League 400 freestyle relay. He is All League in the 50 freestyle, an event in which he set a new Lindenhurst school record with a time of 22.31. Mark is County Champion in both the 200 individual medley, with a time of 1:58.18, a new Lindenhurst school record, and the 100 breaststroke Suffolk county record holder (58.53). He was voted the Most Valuable Swimmer in Suffolk County by officials at this year's individual county championship meet.

Mark received special recognition when he was the January 5, 1994 featured athlete in "Spotlight," a weekly column

on local high school athletes in **Newsday**. He has been headlined, photographed, and quoted in that paper on numerous other occasions.

Mark is an Honor Student and a perennial Scholar-Athlete. His goal is to be accepted at Stanford University after graduating from Lindenhurst in 1995.

Swimmer Mark Biegluk, who arrived from Poland in the summer of 1992, became an instant celebrity at Lindenhurst because his athletic and academic achievements were mentioned often in principal Paul Fried's daily public-address announcements to the student body.

Blegluk (pronounced Beegluke), who began swimming in Poland at age 9, was that country's champion or runner-up in age-group from his 12th through 15th birthdays.

By the time he was 16, he had moved to Lindenhurst with his family and broken two Suffolk records as a sophomore: 58.53 seconds in the 100-yard breast-stroke and 1:06.91 in the 100-meter breaststroke.

"He was like a gift from heaven." said Rich Ryan, who is in his sixth year of coaching Lindy's boys swim team. "Having an instant All-America like him helped me to tap into the large Polish-American community we have in our town. This year I have six Polish-born swimmers on my roster [of 22] Mark's success made them all come out for the sport and they all turned out to be as hard-working as he is."

Now a 17-year-old junior, Biegluk won the 100-yard breaststroke and 200 individual medley at last winter's Suffolk championships. He placed third in the breaststroke at the state meet behind two-time champion Gregory Mone of Manhasset.

"I wouldn't be surprised if Mark beat Mone at this year's states," Ryan said of his 6-4, 178-pound superstar, "Mark has the incredibly strong legs and extremely streamlined body you need in this event. His entering dive and turns take him more than halfway across the pool under water. I think we're talking about a future Olympian here:"

"I'm aiming very high," Biegluk said, sounding almost embarrassed by his self-confidence. "I wish to go to [defending NCAA champ] Stanford for swimming and computer programming."

Ryan laughed and said: "With this kid, I wouldn't bet against it."














MARCHING BAND

In the U.S., trees are a renewable resource. We recycle paper not so much to save a tree — but because in many cases it requires less energy to recycle paper than to produce virgin paper. Conserving energy is the first step in preserving our natural world.




